

### **Pension Application for Quartus Alexander**

W.1794 (Widow: Mary)  
B.L.St.26808-160-55  
State of Vermont  
Windsor County SS

On this 25<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1832 personally appeared before the Probate Court for the District of Hartford in the said County of Windsor Quartus Alexander a resident of Hartland in the County of Windsor & in S'd District and State of Vermont aged 71 years, who being first duly sworn, according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832.

That he enlisted in the army of the United States in January in the year 1665 with Capt Thomas Alexander and served in Col. Elisha Porters Regiment (as a regiment raised to reinforce the Continental Army then near Quebec) a regiment of the Massachusetts line, under the following named officers—viz. Capt Thomas Alexander Lieut [blank] Poole, Ensign Abner Nims, Daniel Breck Chaplain of s'd Regiment, Col. Elisha Porter. That he served as waiter to his father.

That on the 4<sup>th</sup> of March following his enlistment he marched to the Plains of Abraham and there joined the continental army the last of April, and retreated the 6<sup>th</sup> of May following to Ticonderoga and there staid some months then marched to Albany N.Y. & there staid a few days. Then marched to Morristown New Jersey and there staid till his term of service expired.

That he enlisted for the term of one year—and was discharged by reading general order before the regiment.

He further says that his father volunteered immediately after he was discharged as aforesaid with a part of his company (his father being captain) he among said volunteers and joined the New Jersey militia for one month and was stationed at Springfield farm near Elizabeth town New Jersey and that he was discharged at the end of said month by general order & immediately left the service.

That he resided in Northfield and in the County of Hampshire & State of Massachusetts at the time he entered the service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state.

He further says that he has no documentary evidence of his said service.
