

Pension Application for Jonathan Bagley

To the Secretary of the Department of War of the United States.

Jonathan Bagley of Brandon in the County of Rutland & State of Vermont respectfully applies to be place on the pension list of the United States agreeable to the provisions of the Act of Congress passed at their present Session Entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary War. (Signed with his mark) Jonathan Bagley. April 1st 1818. Pittsford.

I Jonathan Bagley of Brandon in the County of Rutland & State of Vermont of the age of fifty one on the 11th of this month, do testify & say that I served the United States in the war of the revolution against the common enemy on the Continental establishment as a private soldier from the last of Augt. or first of Sept 1782 until the 24th of Dec. 1783 that I enlisted in Northampton in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts was mustered at Springfield in the in the State afos'd and joined the Army at Burbanks point Kings ferry was attached to the first Massachusetts Regt commanded by Col. Joseph Vose Capt John Milts till the spring following and then Capt Timothy [R?] took the command of the Company in whose Company I served till Decr 24th 1783 when I rec'd a honorable discharge signed by Genl Knox at West Point which discharge I have lost.

I further say that I have a wife and six children who depend on my daily labor for their support being entirely destitute of property and by reason of my reduced circumstances in life I am in need of assistance from my country for support. (Signed with his mark) Jonathan Bagley
