

Pension Application for Timothy S. Barton

Letter in folder dated August 20, 1937, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your request for information in regard to Timothy Stow Barton, who served as private with the Massachusetts troops, War of the Revolution, and died June 30, 1844 in Warren County, New York.

Timothy S. Barton was born in October, 1758 at Spencer, Worcester County, Massachusetts. The names of his parents were not stated.

He enlisted at Charlton, Massachusetts, May 2, 1775, served as a private in Captain William Campbell's company, Colonel Ebenezer Learned's Massachusetts regiment and was discharged in; January, 1777; he immediately re-enlisted and served as a private ij Captain; Isaac Bolster's company, Colonel Ebenezer Learned's Regiment, and was discharged January 1, 1777, at Trenton, New Jersey, but upon the request of his officers served for an additional six weeks. He was at the evacuation of New York City, and in the battles of Frog's Point, Trenton, and Princeton.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 7, 1819, at which time he was living in Bolton, Warren County, New York.

The soldier, Timothy S. Barton, died June 30, 1844.

Jonathan Barton, brother of the soldier, was living in 1819 in Bolton, New York.
