

Pension Application for Asa Brown

On this third day of December 1832, personally appeared in open court before Samuel S. Seward, John Hallock Jun., Gilbert Ogden, Fowler J. Horace, W. Elliott, Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in & for the said County of Orange, now sitting Asa Brown a resident of the Town of Montgomery, Orange County and State of New York, aged seventy seven years on the 15th day of May last past who being first duly sworn—according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein; stated—and the said Asa Brown deposeth and saith, that he entered the service of the United States in the month of July or August in the year 1776 as this deponent believes, inlisted [enlisted] in Capt. John Little's Company, Col. Nicoll's Regiment for five months and served the whole term, was stationed a part of the time at Kings-bridge, near New York and a part of the time at Peakskill where he was discharged while the company was stationed at White Plains I was sick at home, and this deponent further saith that he again inlisted in the month of April 1779 in Capt. William Faulkner's Company and was shortly thereafter transferred to Capt. Wood's Company Col. Paulding's Regiment for nine months, served eight months & a half and was discharged, was stationed a part of the time at Peenpack & Warsink on the frontiers in Orange & Ulster Counties, a part of the time at Fishkill & Stoney Point on the Hudson River, discharged at Poukeepsie [Poughkeepsie] – served as principle under both of the above described inlistments, and this deponent further saith that exclusive of the two companies before described that he served at sundry time during the Revolutionary War under Cap'n Moses Cortright, Lieut Steward, who commanded a company, Capt'n Vail and others—on the frontiers of Orange & Ulster Counties at Ramipo [sic] and other places more than one year, my services in the whole amounting to more than two years—and this deponent further saith that on no occasion he received a written discharge.
