

Pension Application for Jacob Buckhout

W.24689 (Widow: Jane Hammond) Married 11 January 1787. Jacob died in 1810.

State of New York

County of Westchester SS.

On this eighth day of October 1846 before Henry White one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said county personally appeared Jane Buckhout a resident of Greenbush in the county and State aforesaid aged seventy seven years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838, entitled an act, granting half pay and pensions to certain widows.

That she is the widow of Jacob Buckhout who was a soldier in the War of the Revolution in the Militia of the County of Westchester and as she has been informed & believes served in the capacity of Corporal under Capt. George Comb, how long he served deponant can not state but believes that he served at least one year or more.

That she was married to the said Jacob Buckhout, on the eleventh day of January in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven. And that her husband the said Jacob Buckhout, died in the year one thousand eight hundred and ten.

That she has not intermarried but continues the widow of the said Jacob Buckhout. And that her maiden name was Jane Hammond.

That she was not married to said Buckhout prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, viz at the time above stated. (Signed with her mark) Jane Buckhout
