

Pension Application for Conrad Bush

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act entitled “an act for the Relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the Revolution”, approved on the 15th of May 1828 I Conrad Bush of the town of Pompey in the county of Onondaga & State of New York, do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war, and continued in its service until its Termination, at which time, I was a Matross in Captain John Dougherty’s Company in the Second New York Artillery Regiment, of the line—and I also Declare that I never did receive according to ;my recollection certifies for the reward of ;eighty dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve passed the 15th of May 1778 and I further Declare that I was not on the 15th of May 1828 on the Pension list of the United States.

Witness my had this seventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred twenty eight. (Signed) Conrad Bush.

Letter in folder dated February 8, 1939, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your request for the Revolutionary War record of Conrad Bush, who died about 1854 or 1855, in Pompey, New York, aged about one hundred years.

The data furnished herein were obtained from papers on file in claim for pension, S.46424, based upon service of Conrad Bush in the War of the Revolution.

The date and place of birth of Conrad Bush, and names of his parents were not stated. He was a German who came to this country shortly before “the war”.

He served as matross in Captain John Doughty’s company in the Second Regiment of Artillery, and was discharged June 9, 1783. The length of his service was not stated.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 7, 1828, at which time he was living in Pompey, Onondaga, New York.

He died December 19, or 28, 1854.

The papers on file in this claim contain no discernible data in regard to family.
