

Pension Application for Benjamin Chadsey

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the Revolution approved on the 15th of May `828 I Benjamin Chadsey of the town of Clifton in the County of Saratoga in the State of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war and continued in its service until the termination at which period I was mustered in the Hospital Staff Department and acted as waiter to Doctor Nordeau Hale then Surgeons-mate in Colo John Lambs Regiment of Artillery in the New York Line and that I enlisted in the Company of Ca;t William Harvey in the aforesaid Regiment.

And I also declare that I have not to my recollection or belief received the Certificate for the reward of eighty Dolears [Dollars] but that I [am] entitled to the said reward under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th of May 1778.

And I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of march 1828 on the pension list of the United States.

And I further declare that at the termination of the aforesaid war I received a regular discharge from the service but that the same is lost. (Signed) Benjamin Chadsey
