

**Pension Application for Daniel Champion or Champin**

On this 3d day of July AD 1832 personally appeared in open Court before the Judges of the County Court for said County of Addison now sitting Daniel Champion a Resident of the town of Ferrisburg and late of Panton in said County aged 69 years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States in the month of Sept'r AD 1776 under Leiut David Valleance in a Company under the command of Capt Burroughs in Colo. Seth Warners Regt, Mathew Lyon being the Leiut and Sam'l Beach ensign of the same Comp'y. That he enlisted for the term of three years, he then residing in Sunderland in the County of Bennington and State aforesaid.

That he continued in Service for the space of three years and until his tour of service expired when he was honorably discharge in Sept'r 1779 at Fort George at the head of Lake George being at that time under the command of Major John Chipman of Warners Regt. The former part of the term of service was spent at Ticonderoga and when that was abandoned by St. Clair the Regt retreated to Manchester, this deponent going by way of Whitehall was not in the battle at Hubbardon—when the detachment under Colo Baum moved towards Bennington the Regt of Warren moved to meet them, this deponent was then attached to that Regt and was afterwards at Albany, Fort Edward and lastly at Fort George where he was discharged as aforesaid.

That he was placed on the pension roll of the [?] Agency on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of Sept 1819 at the rate of 8 doll per month but was dropped therefore on account of his property.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present and he declares that his name Is not on the Pension Roll of any agency in any State.
