

**Pension Application for John Mary or Marie Chartier**

W.17598 (Widow: Sally) Salley Robenet and John Marie Chartier married May 13, 1783. John died June 25, 1832.

John Chartier, Case.

Evidence taken by me Ezra Hoty Esqr Judge of the County Court within and for the County of Addison on application of John Chartier of Panton in said County of Addison to be placed on the pension list of the United States in pursuance of an Act of Congress entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War” passed March 18, 1818 he having served in the war of the revolution against the common enemy from the year 1776 to the end thereof on the Continental establishment as a private soldier and by reason of his reduced circumstances in life is in need of assistance from his country for support – to wit.

The said John Chartier being duly sworn deposes and says that some time in the year 1776 to the best of his recollection, he having lost his discharge he enlisted as a private soldier into Capt Pullen Company of Colo Hazen’s Regiment known by the appellation of Congress; our during the war, and he further says that he returned with said Regiment during the term of his enlistment and served as a private soldier therein against the common enemy faithfully during said term; and at the close of the war he was honorably discharged by Genl Washington at New Windsor on the North river in the State of New York—and he further says that he now is and since the year 1783 has been a citizen of the United States, and by reason of his reduced circumstances in life is in need of assistance from his country for support.
