

Pension Application for Robert Chase

W.6911 (Widow: Sarah Revel) robert died April 2nd 1831.

Robert Chase for the purpose of taking the benefit of an Act of Congress entitled, "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War, came into Court and took the following oath, to wit.

State of Missouri

Fourth Judicial Circuit, Set.

On this twenty seventh day of August in the year 1823 personally appeared in open Court for the County of Cape Girardeau in said Circuit (being a Court of Record) robert Chase aged sixty five years, resident in said County, who being first duly sworn according to law Doth on his Oath declare, That he served in the Revolutionary War as follows. That some time in the year 1788 he enlisted near FishKill Town State of New York, in the company commanded by Captain Townsen of the Regiment commanded by Colonel Vanschaick, in the Line of the State of New York on the continental Establishment. That he was at the battle of York Town, and badly wounded in the right hand when Cornwallis was taken. That he was discharged near FishKill Town in New York sometime in the year 1782, having served as a private soldier for the term of three years. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary war, "Passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or Debts due to me, nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. (Signed with his mark) Robert Chase
