

Pension Application for Nathaniel Chatterdon or Chatterton

W.15641 (Widow: Mary) Married Mary Storm in October 23, 1783, by Revd Chase, who was a Presbyterian minister in Pleasant Valley near Poughkeepsie, Dutchess County. They were married at her father's house about four miles from Poughkeepsie. Nathaniel died August 2, 1835. Mary stated November 23, 1844 that she was 93 years.

I Nathaniel Chatterton aged seventy two years do upon oath testify and declare that about or in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty two I enlisted or entered the service as a private for the term of "during the war" in the regiment, commanded by Col. Lamb and served in said regiment until the close of the war when I was regularly discharged from the said Regiment.

I further declare that I have never received a warrant for the bounty lands promised to me on the part of the United States, now have I ever assigned or transferred any claim in any manner whatsoever.

Therefore know all men by these presents that I Nathaniel Chatterton aforesaid do hereby constitute and appoint Orlo Edgerton of Rouses Point in the County of Clinton to be my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to claim and receive from the Secretary of War of the United States, a warrant for the quantity of land due to me as aforesaid and my said attorney is hereby fully authorized and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or attorneys under him for the special purposes above expressed.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of an act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the Army of the Revolution" approved on the 15th day of May 1828 I Nathaniel Chatterdon of Champlain in the State of New York do hereby declare, that I enlisted in the Continental Line of the Army of the Revolution for & during the war & continued in its service until its termination; at which periods I was a private in Captain Thomas's Company in Colo. Lamb's Artillery Regiment of the New York Line. And I also declare that I afterwards received certificates for the reward of eighty dollars, to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th May 1778.

And I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of May 1828 on the Pension List of the United States.
