

**Pension Application for Garret or Gerret Constable**

On this 28<sup>th</sup> April 1818 before me the subscriber first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the county of Ulster personally appears Garret Constable aged sixty two years resident in the Town Hurley in the said County who being by me first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the Provision made by the late act of Congress entitled An Act to provide for certain Persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War.

That he the said Gerrit Constable enlisted in the company of Captain Edward Lounsberry in the Regiment of Coll Philip VanCortlandt of New York State troops on the Continental Establishment in the month of April in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight—and was mustered on the sixth day of May in the same year at Eastor [sic] in the State of Pensylvania [sic] to serve for the period of nine months during that Campaign where he joined his said company and joined the main Army at Valley Forge under the Command of Genl Washington and that he was in the Battle of Monmouth during that campaign in which he discharged [?] Rounds and at the Close of the Campaign he was discharged from the said company and regiment about the last of February one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine—at the Town of Wawarsink in the County of Ulster and State aforesaid at which place the said Regiment had then taken up their winter quarters.

That he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. (Signed with his mark) Gerret Constable
