

**Pension Application for Christopher Crumb or Schoonover**

On the 30<sup>th</sup> day of April 1819, before me the subscriber, President Judge of the eighth circuit of the Court of Common Pleas for the State of Ohio, personally appeared Christopher Crumb aged fifty seven years, who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following statement and declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late law of Congress entitled. "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war", that he is a citizen of the State of Ohio, and resident in the County of Scioto and that he was enlisted for and during the revolutionary war at Minidisk in the State of New York on or about the first day of December in the year 1778 under Lieutenant Christopher Cadvis and that he was first under the command of Captain Charles Newkirk of the second company of the second New York Regiment commanded by Colonel Philip Courtland belonging to the Brigade commanded by Brigadier General Clinton and the deponent further saith that he went with major General Sullivan on the campaign to the Westward against the Indians.

That he was afterwards on command under Captain Timbrook on the Northern lines, in the State of New York where he received a severe wound in his left hip.

This deponent also saith that he continued in the said crops, or in the service of the United States, in the continental army, against the common enemy, until the seventh day of June 1783 when he was honorably discharged from service at Newburgh while under the command of Captain Jacob Wright in the State of New York and that he was in the service about four years and six months and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has lost his discharge by time and accident and has no evidence in his power, of his services, and discharge; other than that which is here transmitted.
