

**Pension Application for Harmacy or Harma or Henna or Mehitable Davis**

State of New York

Oneida County SS.

Harmacy Davis being sworn saith that he is a resident of the County of Oneida and State of New York—that he is Fifty Eight—years old and upwards that by reason of his reduced circumstances he is in need of assistance from his country for support, that he never had any pension allowed him by the laws of the United States.

That he served as a soldier in the war of the Revolution on the continental Establishment five years. He enlisted in 1776 in Horton's Company Rickmores Regt New York line and served therein one year after which he in 1777 enlisted in Pells company, VanCortlandt's Regt and served four years or thereabouts when he was honorably discharged. His discharge is lost. (Signed) Harmacy Davis

Letter in folder dated April 23, 1924, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim R.2748 it appears that Harmacy Davis enlisted in February 1778 and served one year as a private in Captain Horton's Company, Colonel Richmond's New York Regiment; was at the battles of White Plains and Trenton.

He enlisted in 1777 and served four years and six months as a private in Colonel VanCortlandt's New York Regiment; was at the taking of Burgoyne and Battle of Monmouth.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 14, 1818 while a resident of Westmoreland, Oneida County, New York aged fifty-eight years. In 1820 he referred to his daughters Rachel aged eighteen years and Charlotte aged fifteen years. He died February 5, 1829 in the village of Ogdensburg in the town of Oswegatchie, Saint Lawrence County, New York.

Soldier married June 19, 1781 in Hadley, Hampshire County, Massachusetts, Mehitable Dean, who in 18328 was aged seventy-five years and living in Canton, Saint Lawrence County, New York with their daughter Mahetable Gray aged forty-three years.
