Pension Application for Thomas Dixon

W.5263 (Widow: Amy) State of New York Onondaga County SS.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and Soldiers of the Army of the Revolution approved on the 15th of May 1828. I, Thomas Dixon of the Town of Pompey in the County of Onondaga and State of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental Line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war and continued in its service until its termination, at which period I was a Matross in Captain Cornelius Swarthouts company in the Second in New York Artillery Regiment of the New York line, commanded by Colonel John Lamb.

And I also declare that I afterwards received certificates for back rations, but cannot say whether I received certificates for a reward of eighty dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th of May 1778.

And I further declares that I was not on the fifteenth day of May 1818 or at any time [?] on the pension list of the United States.
