

Pension Application for Francis Donita, Donetty or Donety

Addison County SS.

On this 3d day of July 1832 personally appeared before the Judges of the County Court in open Court, Francis Donita a resident in Whiting in said County of Addison aged about seventy six years, who being first duly sworn, according to law making on oath, the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed the 7th June 1832.

That he the s'd Francis Donita, enlisted in the year 1776 in New York in Capt David Lyons' Company, and in Col. (afterwards Genl) McDougall's Regiment for one year on the Continental establishment and served out s'd enlistment.

And in the year 1777 he again enlisted in the month of February in a company commanded by Capt. Stanton, in a Regiment commanded by Col. Sherburn—for the term of three years, on the Continental establishment & served out s'd enlistment and was discharged at Morristown in New Jersey in the year 1780 and at the time of his discharge, the Brigade to which he belonged was commanded by General Stark, that he had a discharge which is lost, that s'd last enlistment took place in Rhode Island.

That he hereby relinquishes all claim to any pension except the present and that he is not on the roll of any agency in any of the estates.

And the said Francis Donita further states.

And the said Francis Donita further declares that he has been on the pension roll under the act of the e18 March 1818, and has been dropped therefrom on account of property, and that he then & still resides in Whitney aforesaid and that his pension certificate is dated the 28 April 1819 and Numbered 9930. (Signed with his mark) Francis Donita.
