Revolutionary Claims

Form of a declaration to be made by the officers.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of an act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers, of the Army of the Revolution" approved on the 15th of May 1828, I Cary Dunn, Junior of the City and County of New York in the State of New York do hereby declare that I was an officer in the Continental Line of the Army of the Revolution, and served as such to the end of the Revolutionary War at which period I was a Major and Commanding Officer, Detachment of Rangers, in the line of the Army, and I also declare I was entitled under the resolve of the 25th of October 1780 five years pay having never received any payment for half [?] by 1 half resolve.

Witness my hand this twenty eight day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight. (Signed) Cary Dunn, Junior
