

Pension Application for Henry Easton or Eason

I Henry Eason aged 79, a citizen of the United States now residing in the Alm-House in New Haven in New Haven County, do declare on oath, that I was born in England & came to this country before the revolutionary war—

That I served in the revolutionary war on the Continental establishment more than six years.—

That I was in the service a soldier at the taking of Ticonderoga & at the siege of Quebec—

That I soon after enlisted a soldier to serve during the war in Cap. Tiebout's Company in the first Regiment then commanded by Col. Gansevoort in the New York line of the Army & continued to serve in the same regiment till transferred to VanSchaick's Reg't in the first or second regiment--& was then honourably discharged—at the close of the war.

I further on oath declare that by reason of my reduced circumstances I need the assistance of my country for support.

I therefore pray that I may be placed on the pension list of the United States according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the e18 March 1818. Dated at New Haven on April 1, 1818. (Signed with his mark) Henry Easton
