

**Pension Application for John Fradenburgh or Frederburgh**

On this 8<sup>th</sup> day of April 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Rensselaer personally appears John Fradenburgh resident in Hoosick in said County who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War."

That he the said John Fradenburgh enlisted he thinks in February 1776 in the company commanded by Captain McCracken in Colo. VanSchaick Regiment for the term of one year in the New York line and served in that corps the full term of one year and was discharged in Albany in said State that he again enlisted into the battleax service for [?] months under [???] and served the term of his enlistment and was discharged at Fishkill in the State of New York and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.

Peter Fradenburgh after being duly sworn deposeth and saith that he knows the above named John Fradenburgh enlisted into the army of the United States in the Revolutionary War for one year and that he served the full term of his enlistment. Sworn 8<sup>th</sup> April 1818.
