

Pension Application for James Fredenburgh

On this sixteenth day of April 1818 before me the subscriber, one of the Justices of the Supreme Court of Indicare State of New York, personally appears James Fredenburgh aged fifty seven years, resident in Albany in the said State who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land an naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war."

That he the said James Fredenburgh enlisted in Rhinebeck in the state of New York in the company commanded by Captain Israel Smith, Henry B. Livingston's Regt of the New York line, Continental Establishment that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States until the last of May or first of June 1783, when he was discharged from service near New Windsor state of New York, that he was in the battles of Peekskill and at the taking of Genl Burgoyne, and on Genl Sullivan's expedition against the Indians.

That he entered the service in the year 1776.

That his discharge is lost and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. (Signed with his mark) James Fredenburgh
