

Pension Application for Isaac W. Fryer

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

State of New York

County of Albany SS.

On the twenty fourth day of August 1832, personally appeared in open court before the Justices of the Court of the City of Albany, now sitting Isaac W. Fryer a president of the Town of Guilderland in the county of Albany and state of New York, aged 6 March last seventy years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

That he was enrolled at the age of sixteen years in Capt. N. Joralemon's Company of Militia in the City of Albany and marched from thence to Fort Hunter and from thence to Stoneroby [Stone Arabia] and after remaining there some considerable time then marched to Fort Planck and again back to Stoneroby and lay there sometime in a fort called Fort Snell & were ordered to march to Fort Plain where the militia after being in garrison a while were marched to Fort Planck again and thence to Stoneroby, and were discharged in Fort Snell then commanded by a Major VanBeuren, from Schodack and returned to Albany.

That he has on various occasions been called out as a private in the militia in the Company commanded by Capt. Joralemon, and with the Albany Regiment commanded by Col. Abraham Cuyler of the City of Albany in excursions and expeditions to various parts of the frontiers, both by night and day the precise times of which he cannot now detail with accuracy, nor the various terms of service, (and they were not few, nor far between) in which he has been called out for the purpose of apprehending conspirators & of quelling the tories and disaffected persons in the County of Albany and its vicinity, but he can confidently state and doth unhesitatingly declare that the whole period of his services, was not less than twelve months, and more.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity, except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. (Signed) Isaac W. Fryer
