

Pension Application for Daniel Fuller

Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of June 7, 1832.

State of New York

County of Rensselaer SS.

On this third day of October 1832 personally appeared in open court before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of said County now sitting, Daniel Fuller a resident of Berlin county of Rensselaer and State of New York, aged sixty nine years who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein [blank]

That in the year 1780 he resided in the Town of (what is now) Berlin County of Rensselaer & State of New York that on or about the month of April in that year he entered the service by enlistment into the State troops of the said State & enlisted for seven months under Captain Harrison in colonel John Harper's regiment that Ezra Buel the deponent in one of the affidavits hereunto annexed was his Lieutenant.

That he served during this enlistment at Fort Edward, Fort Ann, Palmertown & the places in the said State of New York & the company was discharged at the end of his term of enlistment at Fort Stanwix in said State.

That on or about the first of August 1781 at the same place he again enlisted into the service under Captain Livingston in Colonel Marinus Willet's regiment for four months that he served this tour along the Mohawk River & was discharged at Fort Herkimer in said State about the first of December 1781.

That he has no documentary evidence of his services and that he knows of no person whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his services except what is hereunto annexed—

To the prescribed Interrogatories put by the Court he answers.

1. He was born in what was then called the great Nine Partners in the State of New York in the year 1763.

2. He has a family record of his age.

3. He lived when he entered the service as first above stated when he now does & has ever since resided.

4 & 5 For answers to these interrogatories he refers to his above statement.

6. He never received a written discharge.

7. He is known in his present neighborhood to Preston Hammond Esq & to John Reeve Esq, [?] who can testify as to his character for veracity & their belief of his services as a soldier of the revolution.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity, except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. (Signed) Daniel Fuller
