

Pension Application for Ezekiel Gee

Be it rembered [remembered] that on this thirteenth day of August 1820 personally appeared before the Court of Common Pleas holden at Delhi in and for the Couonty of Delaware, being a court of record and so declared by acts of the Legislature of the State of New York aforesaid at this then August Term of said Court. Ezekial [sic] Gee living in the town of Hancock, in said County of Delaware who being fully sworn deposeth and saith that the exact age of this deponent is to him unknown and that he served in the revolutionary was as follows that in the month of June 1781 he enlisted in a company commanded by Captain Benjamin Walker in a regiment commanded by Colonel Philip VanCortland being at that time the 2d New York regiment as a private for during the war that on the twenty third day of May 1818 he made his original declaration; for a pension and that he has received a certificate numbered 8,176.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of any property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the eland and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.
