

### **Pension Application for Silas Gray**

S.43637

B.L.Wt828-300-Capt. Issued Aug 23, 1790 to Caleb Sweet assignee.

Cannot read enough of this deposition to be worth the while.

Letter in folder dated February 6, 1928, written in response to an inquiry.

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S.43637, it appears that Silas Gray was born May 19, 1751, place not stated.

He served from May 1, 1775 to June 23, '783 as Captain in Colonel Henry B. Livingston's New York Regiment, and was in the battles of St. Johns, Montreal, Quebec, Capture of Burgoyne, and Monmouth.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 16, 1818, while a resident of Guilderland, Albany County, New York.

He died January 19, 1820.

There are no data as to family.

The above noted Silas Gray or Grey is the only soldier of that name found on the Revolutionary War records of this Bureau, not do said records afford any information in regard to any soldier named Benjamin Franklin Harris and Franklin Harris.
