

Pension Application for John Grownhart

On this 28th day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Common Pleas for the said County personally appeared, John Grownhart aged seventy nine years, resident in Sullivan in the said County who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:"

That he, the said John Grownhart enlisted in German Flatts in the state of New York in the company commanded by Captain Andrew Fink of the New York line, in Col. VanSchaick's Regiment in the year 1777 as a private; that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the eservice of the United States until the month of August 1780 when he was discharged from service at Fort Stanwix state of New York, that he was in the battles of taking Burgoyne & Monmouth and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
