

Pension Application for Jonathan Hallett

On this 12th day of May 1818 before me the subscriber first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Herkimer personally appears Jonathan Hallett aged seventy years and four months resident in the Town of Fairfield in said County who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land an naval service of the United States in the revolutionary War".

That he the Jonathan Hallett entered into the service of the United States at the commencement of the revolutionary war, and served the first campaign in a Company commanded by Capt. Nathaniel Woodard in Col. Holmes' Regiment of the State of New York; the second campaign he served in Capt. Riker's Company as first Lieutenant in Col. Ritzman's Regiment; that in the Fall of 1776 he was appointed a Captain in the second New York Regiment commanded by Col. Philip VanCourtlandt in which capacity he continued to serve until the army was disbanded in 1783; that he was in the Battles at the taking of Genl Burgoyne at Monmouth, at the Capture of Lord Cornwallace and in Genl Sullivan's Indian Expedition, and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that the only evidence now in his power of his said services is the commission under which he served.
