

### **Pension Application for William Harris**

R.4673 William died in the Town of Northumberland, Saratoga County, New York on the 27<sup>th</sup> of November 1826. His wife Lucy died previously.

There is no deposition by William or Lucy in the file. The children were attempting to apply and receive their father's pension.

On this 13<sup>th</sup> day of June 1848 before a Surrogate Court holden at the Village of Saratoga Springs in said County in open court personally appeared William D. Sutfin (the husband of Lucy Suffin, married at Northumberland Saratoga Co., July 4<sup>th</sup> 1808, and aged sixty two years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of an act of Congress of May 15<sup>th</sup> 1838.

That he was well acquainted with William Harris a Continental soldier in the Revolution War spoken of by William Harris & Lucy Suffin my wife, having heard their affidavits read, concur with him in all the material facts in relation to the declarations made by him during his lifetime about his serving as a Sergeant in Captain Barney Hicks Col., in Col. VanSchaicks Regiment of New York Troops having heard him speak of many incidents that occurred in the Revolution, that he has heard other soldiers of the Revolution state (now passed away) that fully satisfied me that William Harris was a soldier in the Continental line during the ar of the Revolution and served as a sergeant during the War, according my opinion & belief.
