

Pension Application for Paul Hausman or Poal Hoasman

Revolutionary Claims. The Declaration of Paul Hausman

For purpose of obtaining the benefits of the Act entitled “an act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldier of the Army of the revolution” approved on the 15th day of May 1828.

I Paul Hausman of Mooers in the County of Clinton in the State of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the army of the Revolution, for and during the war and continued in its service until its termination, at which period I was a prisoner in Canada having been taken at Sorele where I was marched to aid in the attack upon Quebec—under General Arnold and was a private in Captain John’s Company of Artillery in what regiment or line I do not recollect being now eighty years of age. And I also declare that I did not receive my certificate in consequence of being a prisoner in Canada as aforesaid.

And I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of May 1828, on the pension list of the United States.

Witness my hand this thirty first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine. (Signed with his mark) Paul Hausman

Before me Abel Ford a Justice of the Peace duly empowered to administer oaths in the County of Clinton in the State of New York personally appeared this day Finley Fisher and John fisher of the said County who did severally make oath that Paul Hausman by whom the foregoing declaration was subscribed is generally reputed and believed to have been a soldier in the army of the revolution in manner as theirin satted.
