

**Pension Application for Joseph Hicks**

W.11297 (Widow: Julia Ann) Married December 25, 1821. He died September 4, 1835.

To the Hon. The Secretary at War

I Joseph Hicks and old revolutionary soldier on my solemn oath do declare and say that I enlisted into the service of the United States in August 1776 into Col. Dubois regt York Line, I served until the month of February 1777 and was then discharged.

I[n] April 1777 I again enlisted; during the war into Capt. Robert Watkins Company, Col Robert Malcoms Regt York line, Independent Regt. In the year 1779 in May I was transferred into Colo Oliver Spencers Regt Jersey Line under the Command of Genl Maxwell I served in that Regt until until [sic] the year 1780 and then went to Albany and transferred to Colo VanScoix [Colonel VanSchaick] & from thence at Schenectady was transferred to Capt. Philip Courtlands Regt [Depraell's?] Compy and served until the close of the war and was honorably discharged in June 1783 at Snake Hill near Newburgh by Col.Courtland and by Baron Steuben [?] Genl. That my discharge is lost or burnt with my house.

That I have never rec'd any pension from the U. States, nor any one of the states. That from my reduced circumstances in life I need assistance from my country. (Signe) Joseph Hicks
