On this twenty sixth day of September 1820 personally appeared
in open court, the same being a court of record, for the County of Westchester

Holmes Austin

aged twenty years, resident in Pound Ridge of said County,
who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the
revolutionary war as follows:— that he the said Holmes Austin, enlisted in and
during the war, in Westchester County of State of New York in the Com-
pany commanded by Capt. Godwin, in Col. Babin's Regiment
in New York line in the Continental Establishment that he contin-
ued to serve in said Corps until peace took place in 1783 when
he was discharged at Snake Hill, that he was, at the taking of St. John's
the Battle on Cort Island and at the White Plains, that in April
1818 he presented his Original Declaration of his Certificate
N: 2877 bearing date the 17th day of Dec: 1818.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of
the United States, on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, since that time,
by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent
thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress,
entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the
United States in the revolutionary war," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that
I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts,
due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto an-
nexed, and by me subscribed.

*The information concerning the issuance of warrants carded on this form is found in volumes 2 to 4 of "Land Warrants Issued Prior to 1800" which are registers of bounty land warrants issued to non-commissioned officers and privates under congressional resolutions of September 16, 1776, and subsequent dates. Other records relative to the applications for warrants appear to have been destroyed in the War Department fire of November 9, 1800. Information concerning warrants surrendered to the Federal Government is to be found in General Land Office records in The National Archives.
