

### **Pension Application for Moses Hunter**

R.9072 (Elizabeth Rundle, Former Widow) Married Moses 1791, he died December 14, 1814 in the town of Stillwater. Elizabeth married Jabez Rundle November 10, 1820, he died August 2, 1839.

State of New York

City & County of Albany SS.

On this 16<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1842 personally before the Justices Court of the said City of Albany (being a court of record having a clerk & seal) appeared Elizabeth Rundle a resident of Waterford in the County of Saratoga in said State, aged seventy eight years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provisions made by the acts of Congress passed July 7, 1838, and the 23<sup>d</sup> of August 1842 granting pensions to widows of persons who served during the revolutionary war.

That she is the widow of Moses Hunter who was a private of the revolutionary war enlisted in a company of Levies commanded by Capt. Adrial Sherwood and attached to Col. Dubois Regiment that previous to said enlistment said Moses resided at Stillwater, Saratoga County. That said Moses was stationed as such soldier in the month of July 1780 at Fort Ann in said State of New York as a scouting party to guard the Northern frontier.

That in October of the same year the enemy sent a strong force to Fort Ann & said Moses & the whole of Captain Sherwood's company were made prisoners & taken to Canada & confined in Montreal & Quebec about three years as deponent was informed at the time & as she always understood from said Moses and believes to be true. She knows that he did not return until after the peace of 1783.

She also declares that she was married to the said Moses Hunter in the year seventeen hundred & ninety one. That her husband the aforesaid Moses Hunter died on the fourteenth day of December AD 1814; that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first of January seventeen hundred & ninety four; viz at the time above stated.

She further declares that after the death of the said Moses Hunter. She was married to Jabez Rundle on the tenth day of November AD 1820. That he died on the seventh day of August 1837, and that she is still a widow & that in consequence of infirmity she is not unable to write her name. (Signed with her mark) Elizabeth Rundle
