

**Pension Application for John Hunt or Hunt**

W.10129 (Widow: Hannah) They married November 2, 1817. John died January 7, 1834.

Common wealth of Massachusetts, Hampden SS.

On this twenty fourth day of April in the year eighteen hundred and fifty seven, personally appeared before me, the Judge of Probate in and for the County of Hampden in said State, (being by reason of infirmity unable to appear in open Court.) Hannah Hunt, a resident of Granville in said County aged seventy nine years, who first being duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed on the 3d of February 1853, granting pensions to Widows of persons who served during the Revolutionary War—that she is the widow of John Hunt who was a private in the Massachusetts Regiment of troops, and was pensioned for his said services at the rate of \$26.6 per annum as she believes, and is the same person to whom Land warrant N. 24,175 for 160 acres was issued, dated Apr. 22d 1856, as his widow, in pursuance of the act of Congress of March 3d 1855, and for evidence of his services, marriage to applicant and death, reference is had [sic] to papers filed in the Pension office, at the times when said pension certificate and said Land warrant were granted.

She further declares that she was married to the said John Hunt on the 2d day of November 1817 that her said husband died on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of January 1834—that she was not married to him prior to the second of January eighteen hundred, but at the time above stated. She further declares that she is now a widow. (Signed) Hannah Hunt.
