

### **Pension Application for Joshua J. Jackson**

W.7881 (Widow: Susanna) Married in either July or August in 1789, Joshua died in the fall of 1822 or 1823. Joshua served in the New York Line Livingston's Regiment. He was at the storming of Quebec and the surrender of Burgoyne. He was taken prisoner and kept until the close of the war.

State of South Carolina

Edgefield District

On the fifth day of October 1820 in open court being a court of record for the said District & State Joshua J. Jackson aged seventy five years resident in Turkey Creek in said District who first being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows (viz) in Collonel [Colonel] James Livingston's Regt in a company commanded by Capt Abraham Livingston.

That he is now on the pension roll by virtue of the act of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 that his certificate for a pension is dated the eighteenth day of September 1818 and that he has already received his pension from that period till the fourth of March 1820 and he does solemnly swear that he was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 and that he has not since that time by sale gift or in any manner whatsoever disposed of his property or any part thereof with an intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring himself within the provisions of the said act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 and that he has not nor any person in trust for him any property or securities contracts or debts due to him (nor has he any income or estate real personal or mint except the property contained in the following schedule (viz)

One cow \$10

Two hogs Two Shotes & sow & pigs 12

One feather bed & furniture 15

One chest & four old chairs 1.50

1 Do 0.50

½ dozen pewter plates one dish and bason 1.00

Four knives & forks & ½ doz spoons .50

One hoe, 2 old axes, 2 [Augers?] & drawing knife 2.00

Two chisles & 2 Gouges .50

One Pack plain & plain tit & corn papers .50

One pr plow plow geer [gear] 1 colar .50

Pur broken pots oen small De. 1.00

Some poultry .50

That he is exceedingly infirm that he is very dim of sight and hard of hearing that he is unable to labour or work that he has three daughters & one son all of age and acting for themselves and in indigent circumstances and that he has a wife old and decrepit with himself that the cannot look to or elicit support from any one whatsoever if his pension is withdrawn from him Sworn to & declared in open court the day & year above written. (Signed with his mar) Joshua Jackson
