1833 Oct history to L. E. D. Jr.

Robert Meade
Monroe Co, in the State of Illinois
was a private in the Company commanded
by Captain Williams of the regt. commanded
by Col. Montgomerie in the Virginia State
for one year.

Recorded on the Roll of Illinois
at the rate of 40 Dollars — Coats per annum
commence on the 15th day of March, 1831.

Receipt of Pension issued the 27 day of June
1835 — and sent to Hand
Converse, Waterloo, N.Y.

Remitted to the 15th of March 1835 \$160. —
amount allowance ending 28 Sep '35 20

\$180. —

Revolutionary Claim,
Set June 7, 1832.

Declaration

In Order to obtain the benefits of the Act of Congress of the 7th June

1832 State of Illinois }
County of Monroe } On this seventeenth day of April in the year
Eighteen hundred and thirty five personally appears in open Court of
County Common Pleas Court of the County aforesaid Robert Tidd of
Metcher Township in the County of Monroe and State of Illinois aged
twenty five years, who being first duly sworn according to Law
doth on his Oath make the following declaration in Order to obtain
the benefit of the provisions made by the Act of Congress passed June

year 1778 - on the 10th day of May with Captain John Williams
and served in the Col. George Rogers Clarke Regiment of the
Virginia line under the following named Officers: Colo. Clark
was promoted to the Office of Brigadier General and John Hunt
succeeded him in the Command of the Regiment.

and Captain Isaac Boardman was promoted to a Major
in which office he died and Captain John Williams suc-
ceeded him - Richards Brashaers was first Lieutenant and

promoted to a Captain - I do not recollect who was his successor
William Montgomery was our Ensign - I enlisted for one Year
and remained in service from the 10th May 1778 until some

time in the month of March 1780 (but did not enlist the second
time but remained in the army and did the same duty as he
would have done had he re-enlisted being so situated that he could

not go to his place of residence with safety) - I enlisted at the
Talley of Ohio when I resided at that time with Capt. William
Harrod ~~at the time~~ with the Company to Fort Massace on

near there and from there marched to Kaskaskia and Col.
Roubidoux surrendered the place without any fighting - In the

Spring of the year 1779 we marched from Kaskaskia to Fort
Vincennes where was a British fort with one Brass Cannon and
some Iron Guns - which we attacked and which was surrendered to
us with 1500 stands of Arms some Barrels of Gun flints, some
Ammunition - with 110 prisoners who we took to the falls of
Ohio and surrendered them to Captain Thomas and Captain
Harrod ^{who were British Officers} and returned to Kaskaskia where we remained some time
during the warm weather - and the latter part of summer we were
marched to the Iron Banks on the Ohio - where we ~~was~~ ^{skir-}
mished with a party of Chickasaw Indians supposed to be
500 in Number under a Captain Colbert - who was ~~supposed~~ ^{supposed}
that he died and the Indians then dispersed - we returned
to Kaskaskia and remained until the latter part of January
1780. - when I received from Col. Montgomery an Honorable
discharge, which is now lost.

Has hereby relinquished every claim whatever to a pension or an
annuity except the present and he declares that his name is
not on the Pension Roll of any Agency in any State
Sworn to and subscribed the
day and year aforesaid } Robert ^{his} ~~Stidds~~ ^{Stidds}
marks.

In the same day came Ebenezer Bowen and after being duly sworn
According to Law depothed and says that himself was a private
in the same Company with Robert Stidds who has subscribed the
above declaration from the latter part of June 1778. until he was
discharged - and knowing him to be the identical person who swears
with him and knowing the above declaration to be true.
