

**Service Record for Kilts, Philip, Corporal  
Klock's Regiment NY Militia, Phillip Kilts**

Appears as shown below on a Receipt Roll under the following heading:

"We the Subscribers do hereby acknowledge to have received of Col. Jacob Klock (1) Certificates for our Services in the Militia in the late War (of the Numbers & for the Sums placed opposite our Names) Syned by the Treasurer of this State."

On another roll for Klock's Regiment also not dated gives a certificate No. 18608 for March 8, 1780 for £2 . . 16 . . 9. It was delivered to Philip Kilts (2) and witnesses by Joseph Pickard. Another roll dates June 28 but no year given for Klock's Regiment gives another Certificate No. 18975. Again delivered to Philip Kilts and witnessed by Conrad C. Timmerman.

End Notes—Philip Kilts

1. Jacob Klock was the Colonel of the Second Regiment of Tryon County Militia.
2. Philip is listed as serving as a corporal in captain Severinus Klock's Fourth Company in Colonel Klock's Regiment. The Certificate no. 18608 and 18975 were for Corporal Philip Kilts. Philip is listed as serving as a private in Captain Peter Suts' Company and Captain Rudolph Kock's (Kkock, Cook, Kock, etc.) Company both of Colonel Klock's regiment.
