

**Pension Application for William Kincade or Kincaid**

I William Kincade of Corinth in Orange County Vermont a citizen of the United States of America—

Inlisted during the wary March 1 in Capt. John Wandells Company in Col. VanSchaick's Regiment in Genl Clinton's Brigade was transferred several times in the year in 1779 in July I was taken at Fort Schuyler by the Indians and carried to Carlton Island in Lake Ontario and thence to Montreal and to Quebec and was sent Round by water to New York Guy Carlton this having the command was Paroled by Carlton in November 1782 as a Prisoner of War and then went to the American Army and found my old regiment and on the 30th day of November I received a pass by order of Genl Washington the substance of which was to travel the United States unmolested until called for & he was a prisoner three years and four months and no tongue or [?] can describe my suffering. I am now in my 77<sup>th</sup> year and am maintained by the Charity of the Town of Corinth have never rec'd any thing of Consequence for my many services and have had no pension from Government and hereby relinquish any if due me except what I may claim by virtue of a late act of Congress makenly provision for officers & soldiers & c who served in the Revolutionary War and pray that I may be placed on the pension list agreeably to and [sic]Act of Congress. My services were in the New York line &c. Chelsea April 6<sup>th</sup> 1818. (Signed) William Kincade.
