

**Pension Application for Thomas Kingsbury**

On the fifteenth day of September 1820 personally appeared in open court being a court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Cortland in the State of New York held at the Court House in Homer in said County whereof John Keep Esqr is First Judge being a Court of Record with in the district of New York aforesaid Thomas Kingsbury aged sixty eight years resident in Virgil in the County of Cortland in said district who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows that he served in Capt. Nathan Haly Comp in Colo Charles Webb Regiment in the Connecticut line for and during the term of one year that the date of the original declaration was made on the 4 day of May 1818 and that the number of his pension certificate is 4662 and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby as to diminish it or as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or security, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.
