

Pension Application for Abraham Kittle

At a Surrogate court, held in and for the County of Sullivan in the State of New York, the same being a court of Record, held at the office of the Surrogate in the village of Bloomingburgh in said county personally appeared Abraham Kittle a resident of the county of Sullivan aforesaid aged ninety years on the tenth day of August and last and made oath in due form of law in open court, and makes the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June seventh One thousand Eight hundred and thirty two, an act granting pensions to soldiers who served in and during the war of the Revolution. To wit—That he entered the service as a private soldier at Wawarsing in the county of Ulster in the State of New York on or about the first day of October 1779 and served under Captain John J. Hardenburgh at Wawarsing at Hombeck's Fort and other places on the Western frontier in said County to guard the inhabitants against the Indians and remained in the service until peace was proclaimed.

That he was then honorably discharged and returned home. Declarant further states that the reason why he has not made an application for a pension before as he was able to later [?] that he did not until recently know of any person still living by whome [whom] he could prove his services. That he is now poor and unable to labor. (Signed with his mark) Abraham Kittle
