

Pension Application for Augustine Klumph or Klump

At a Surrogate's Court held at the village of Sinclairville in & for the County of Chautauqua at the Surrogate's office therein on the 7th day of May 1852 before Emory F. Warren Surrogate of said County.

Satisfactory evidence has this day been exhibited to said court that Augustine Klumph who was an Express River in the Army of the Revolution died on the 16th day of January A.D. 1837 & left no widow, but left Thomas Klump & Harriet Andrews his only living children.

In testimony whereof the Surrogate of said county;, has hereunto subscribed his name & affixed his seal of office the day & year aforesaid. G. F. Warren, Surrogate.

Augustine Klumph didn't file a deposition, nor did his widow. Apparently Augustine consulted a Lawyer who told him that there was no pension for persons who served as he did.
