

Pension Application for Andrew Knowlton

Letter in folder dated August 3, 1932, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your request for data relative to Andrew Knowlton, a soldier of the War of the Revolution of Nobleboro, Maine.

The data furnished herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, S.37139, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Andrew Knowlton.

He enlisted January 10, 1776 and served in Captain Billy Porter's company in Colonel Israel Hutchinson's Massachusetts regiment, was in the battles of Long Island and Harlem Heights, and was discharged the last day of December of the same year at Morristown, New Jersey. He stated that he was in the battle of King's Bridge, no further details given.

Andrew Knowlton was allowed pension on his application executed April 11, 1818, at which time he was living in Nobleboro, Lincoln County, District of Maine.

In 1820 he was fifty-eight years old and referred to the following family: his wife, Ruth, aged fifty-six years; his daughter, Susan aged thirty-seven years, a widow "whose husband died in the service in the late war" and her children, twins Andrew and Sally aged nine years, Samuel aged seven years, and David aged five years.

Jeremiah Knowlton in 1819 aged seventy-one years and living in Nobleboro, Maine, stated that he belonged to the army at the same time that Andrew Knowlton was in the service, no relationship shown.
