

**Pension Application for Hendrick W. Krum**

W.20371 (Widow: Jane) It doesn't appear as if Hendrick filed for a pension, there is no deposition from him in this folder.

Declaration: In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 4<sup>th</sup> July 1836.

State of New York

County of Ulster SS.

On this twentieth day of December 1843, personally appeared before the Court of common Pleas of the County of Ulster (being a Court of record &c) in the State of New York, William H. Krum a resident of the town of Olive, in the County of Ulster and State of New York aged Fifty Eight years; who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress of the 4<sup>th</sup> July 1836.

First that he the said William H, Krum, together with Matthew Krum, Rebecca, now the wife of Stephen Merrihew, Mary the wife of Aaron Bull. I am the wife of Isaac Lyons, Simon, Hannah the wife of John Schutt, and Henry, the children and only children and heirs of Hendrick W. Krum and Jane his Wife; that the said Hendrick W. Krum and Jane his wife, resided in the town of Olive in said County of Ulster; that his mother's name before her marriage was Jane Phenix, that they were married on the fourth day of May 1777, that the said Hendrick W. Krum died on the second day of February 1827 at Olive aforesaid, leaving the said Jane his widow—that she the said Jane died on the thirtieth day of September 1837, and remained the widow of the said Hendrick W. Krum until her death—and left this deponent William H. Krum, Matthew Krum, Rebecca the wife of Stephen Merrihew, Mary the wife of Aaron Bull, I was the wife of Isaac Lyons, Simon, Hannah the wife of John Schutt and Henry her children and her only children and heirs, and the children and only children and heirs of the said Hendrick W. Krum; and that said children are all of lawful age.

And father that the said Jane Krum, widow of the said Hendrick W. Krum, as this deponent verily believes, was entitled to a pension under the act of Congress of the 4<sup>th</sup> July 1836—and for a statement of the services of the said Hendrick W. Krum in the Revolutionary War, as also for evidence to substantiate the claims of said heirs, reference is made to the Documents and affidavits hereunto annexed. (Signed with his mark) William H. Letter in folder dated July 29, 1931, written in response to an inquiry.

You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.20371, that Hendrick W. Krum, while residing in Marbletown, Ulster County, New York, enlisted and served with the New York Troops as follows—in 1776, five months in Captain John Hasbrouck's Company, in Colonel Hardenburgh's Regiment; in 1777, four months in Captain John Hasbrouck's Company, Colonel Levi Pawling's Regiment; in the fall of 1777, four months in Captain Kortright's Company, Colonel Levi Pawling's Regiment, and was in the siege of Fort Montgomery; from August to December 1778 in Captain Charles Brodhead's Company, Colonel Levi

Pawling's Regiment; early in 1779 out against the Indians under Major Adrian Wynkoop, length of this service not stated; again in 1779, three or four months in Captain Charles Brodhead's Company, Colonel Hathorn or Snyder's Regiment; in 1780, four months in Captain Henry Pawling's Company; in 1781, eight months in Captain Henry Pawling's Company, Colonel Albert Pawling's Regiment. He had several short tours, once under Captain Philip Swart and once under Captain Tobias VanBuren.

The soldier married May 4, 1777, Jane Phenix. The marriage was recorded in the Protestant Reformed Dutch Church of Kingston, Ulster, County, New York.

He died February 2, 1827 in Olive, New York.

His widow, Jane, died in Olive, New York, September 30, 1837, leaving the following children, who were allowed the pension due her; William H. Krum, who in 1843, was aged fifty-eight years and living in Olive, New York; Matthew Krum; Rebecca, wife of Stephen Merrihew, Mary, wife of Aaron Bull or Ball; Jane, wife of Isaac Lyons; Simon Krum, who in 1843 was aged forty-nine years and living in Olive, New York; Hannah, wife of John Schutt; and Henry Krum.
