

Pension Application for Moses Lent or Leant

R.6224 (Widow: Phebe) Married January 14, 1785 at Stillwater. Moses died April 29, 1844. One son survived his parents, Reuben.

Moses Lent of the town of Ments in said County of Cayuga and State of N. York being duly sworn deposed and saith that in the year 1778 he listed as a private soldier in Capt Johnsons company in Col. Gansevorts Regt being the third Regt in the your line for during the war that afterwards was transferred into the first Regt commanded by Col. VanSkaich and that he served during the war & was discharged after the peace at Newburg in the State of New York on about the June 8, 1783 & that he has lost his discharge.

And this deponent further saith that by reason of reduced circumstances in life he is in need of assistance for support from his Country and further saith not. (Signed with his mark) Moses Lent
