

Pension Application for George Lindolph or Lynn

On this 20th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two personally appeared in open court before the court of Common Pleas of the County of Montgomery now sitting George Lindolph a resident of the Town of Mayfield in the County of Montgomery and State of New York, aged eighty five years on the nineteenth day of March last past, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served, as herein stated.

In the year 1778 in the month of October the day he cannot state he volunteered in the Militia Service and went from Wall Kill, County of Ulster, State of New York to Fort Montgomery & Fort Clinton on the Highlands, situate along the Hudson River, under Captain John Grahams, Samuel Bartly, Lieutenant & James McCurdy, ensign, belonging to Col. Hasbroucks, Regiment and that he was out two months at this time and was verbally discharged.

That he again in the latter part of November volunteered and went from the place aforesaid to White Plains under the same officers and was out at this time four months and does not recollect the time he was discharged at this time. And that shortly after his return from his tour to White Plains he again volunteered into the service and went from Connisink Ulster County to FishKill and remained there about six weeks and then enlisted into the company of Captain Hentremicks Company of light Infantry in the Second New York Regiment, commanded by Colonel VanCortlandt, that he served in this company commanded, as aforesaid, three years and seven months and went from FishKill to New Jersey, at which place he was in two Battles, to wit, at Monmouth & Burlington the different places he went to after he left, New Jersey this applicant is wholly unable to state on account of the failure of his memory and his age.

He was born in NewBurgh, Orange County, State of New York.

He knows of no person by whom is able to prove all of those services. He says he was born in Newburgh Orange aforesaid—in the year 1746 on the nineteenth day of March. He has no record of his age except a memorandum made in his Bible. He has no written discharge. He resided in Ulster during the war and has resided at his present place of residence since the war.

He is acquainted with the following persons residing in his neighborhood who can testify as to his character for truth and veracity and their belief of his services as a soldier of the Revolution to wit, William Groon [?]

He knows of no regular officers or regiments that served with him or other circumstances than have already been stated by him.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares his name is onto on the pension roll of the agency of any State. He served as a private. (Signed with his mark) George Lynn or Lindolph
