

**Pension Application for Henry Markle, Marcle, Merricle, Marricle, Marrical, or Merical**

W.19877 (Widow: Polly) Henry died Aug 15, 1839.

Testimony in the case of Henry Markle an applicant to be placed on the Pension List under the act of Congress of 18 March 1818.

State of New York

Rensselaer County SS.

Henry Markle a resident of the Town of Schaghticoke, in the County of Rensselaer and State of New York, being duly sworn, doth depose and say. That he enlisted in the Continental Army as a private soldier on the Eighth day of February 1777 in a company commanded by Capt. Joseph McCracken in the First Regiment of the New York line, commanded by Goose VanSchaick. That this deponent continued In the said company and Regiment until the month of February 1780, when this deponent having served the full term of his enlistment (3 years) he was honorably discharged, at Fort Stanwix in the State of New York.

That this deponent's discharge is not now in existence. And this deponent further says that "by reason of his reduced circumstances in life, he is in need of assistance from his country for support." And this deponent further says, That at the battle of Monmouth, he was attached to a company of Light Infantry, commanded by Capt Fink.

That after the battle aforesaid, this deponent returned to the company in which he first enlisted. The said company in consequence of the promotion of Capt. McCracken, was under the command of Capt. Parsons. (Signed with his mark) Henry Markle
