

Pension Application Abraham Martling

W.18473 (Fanny) Married about 1782, died January 1, 1842.

Schedule.

State of New York

WestChester County SS.

On this 28th day of May 1821 personally appeared in open court the same being a Court of Record for the County of WestChester, Abraham Marting aged fifty nine years resident in Greensburgh of s'd County who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows that the s'd Marting enlisted in the year 1778 for and during the War at WestChester County State of New York in the Company commanded by Capt'n Schafner in Col. Armony Regiment—New York Line in the Continental Establishment that he continued in s'd service untill peace took place when he was Dischar'd from s'd service at CharlesTown South Carolina that he was at the taking of Corn Wallace that the 17th day of April 1818 he presented his Original Declaration & Pres't his Certificate No. 28;99 dated the 23rd day of September 1818.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner dispos'd of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War nor has any persons in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereunto annex'd & my me subscribed. Letter in folder dated June 17, 1930, written in response to an in inquiry.

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.18473, it appears that Abraham Martling enlisted in Westchester County, New York, in 1778 or in October 1779, and served as a private in Captain Schaffner's Company in Colonel Armand's Corps, was at the Siege of Yorktown and capture of Cornwallis and was discharged in May or June, 1783.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 17, 1818, at which time he was fifty-five years of age and a resident of Westchester County, New York.

He died January 11, 1841 in Tarrytown, New York.

The soldier married Fanny or Freena Romer. A copy of the records relating to marriages belonging to the Dutch Reformed Church of Mount Pleasant, Westchester County, New York, shows "Abraham Martlings Y.M. met Freena Romer, Y.D. November 28, 1784."

Said Fanny was allowed pension on her application executed May 19, 1843, at which time she was eighty-four years of age and a resident of Haverstraw, New York. Their son, Isaac, was fifty-five years of age in 1843.
