Dear Sir

Your favour of the 9th inst. Was duly received, and in answer thereto have only to say that as a member of the Legislature of the State of Pennsylvania Session [36 of 37?] I applied for and received further the usual grant of the State by an anonomous vote of the House.

In yours received by me you state that John Meyers is marked upon the list as a deserter in 178, from Pulaski's Legion.

The affidavit of Susan Crock being the earliest information at hand, I have hereby inclosed, the event that followed the Battle near Charleston of that part of the Army under Genl Pulaski and Col. Coweth, who were killed, cause the dismemberment of the Army—but John Meyers reenlisted under Col. or Genl Deluson in the Company commanded by Captain Miskesky and that he remained in the army under said commander, or others until after the defeat of and surrender of Lord Cornwallis at Your Town, other evidence if undespensibly necessary might experiance be obtained.
