

**Pension Application for Stephen Millard**

On the sixteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three personally appeared in open court before the Judges thereof to wit: Seth C. Baldwin first Judge, Thomas Patteson, Hiram Barber, Halley Mead and Truman B. Rich Esquire his officiate Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Warren in the State of New York now sitting in the Court house in the town of [Cold?] in said County Stephen Millard a resident of the town of Queensburg in the County & State aforesaid aged eighty two years who being first duly sworn according to [can't make out much on this pension. Normally I would do a supporting deposition, but there appears to be none.]

I Samuel Shaw of Berlin County of Rensselaer and State of New York was a resident of the same place in the year 1777, I was then a lieutenant under Capt. Caleb Bentley and Colonel Stephen I Schuyler of the New York Militia by whom orders the militia of this plan of whom Stephen Millard then of this place was [?] was called into the service (the said Stephen Miller is the same who now requests this affidavit according to the best of recollection and belief." According to the best of my recollection was some time in May 1777 called into service and continued in the service untill after surrender of Burgoione in October following.
