

Pension Application for Moses Mulliner

Judge of the Court of common Pleas of the County of Dutchess which is a Court of Record of the State of New York.

The Declaration under oath of Moses Mulliner formerly a soldier engaged in the Service of the United States, during the Revolutionary War, and now a Citizen of the United States, and resident of Washington in the County of Dutchess.

Respectfully Showeth, that the said Moses in or about the year one thousand seven hundred & seventy seven and before the taking of Burgoyne he enlisted first for three years and afterwards for during the war In the New York line in the American Army in a company commanded by Capt Hallet, having previously enlisted and served in the nine months service on the expedition to Quebec; that he faithfully served under his said enlistments from the year one thousand seven hundred & seventy seven until the Army was discharged in June one thousand seven hundred and eighty three at Snake Hill near Newburgh at which time this deponent belonged to a company commanded by Capt. Israel Smith in Collo. Philip VanCourtlandts Second New York Regiment; that having sold his military lands he a few years after the close of the war delivered his discharge to Philip Hart at aid him in his application for the same [?] which he has [?] from the discharge nor does he know what has become of the same; and that this deponent was in the battles at which places & Monmouth and was present at the captures of Burgoyne and Cornwallis.

And this declaration further representeth that the said Moses Mullin is now a Citizen of the United States, and residing in Dutchess County aforesaid; and is by reason of his reduced circumstances in life, in need of assistance from his country for support; and that he has no pension.

Therefore he conceives himself entitled to the benefit of the Act of the Congress of the United States, entitled, "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," approved, March 18, 1818, and requests that your Honor will examine into the truths of the matters aforesaid, certify and transmit the testimony in this case, and the proceedings had thereon to the Honorable the Secretary of the Department of War, to the end that such relief may be had in the premises, as is by law in such case provided. And in support of the facts above set forth, he refers to the affidavit of Philip Hart herewith annexed. (Signed with his mark) Moses Mulliner.
