On the tenth day of April in [the] year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen personally appeared before me Peter DeNoyelles one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the said County of Rockland, Noah Mott who [who] being sworn and on his oath saith that he Inlisted [enlisted] and Entered the Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six as a Private Soldier in Capt. Hollet [Hallett's] Company in the second New York Regiment commanded by Philip Vancortlandt and continued in said Regiment untill the close of the war and was Discharged in the month of June 1783 and further saith that shortly after he Received his Discharge he put it in the hands of one John Robert and has not since been abel [able] to obtain it and that at the time he Entered the Service he Inlisted for During the War and that he is a Resident of the said County of Rockland and that from his Reduced circumstances he needs the assistance of his country. (Signed with his mark) Noah Mott

This is to certify that the bearer hereof Noah Mott served under my command on the Continental Establishment in Captain Jonathan Hullets Company Second New York Regiment several years and was discharged at the End of the War.
