

Pension Application for Lewis Nowe or Noe

Be it known that on the twenty seventh day of April eighteen hundred and eighteen, before me Gabriel H. Ford Esquire, one of the Judges of the court of Common Pleas for the County of Morris, in the State of Nw Jersey, & President of said Court at Morristown in the County of Morris aforesaid, personally appeared Lewis Noe, who being duly sworn, doth depose, declare and say that he served as a private soldier in the war of the Revolution, against the common enemy on the Continental establishment for the full term of six years and more. That he entered the service in June seventeen hundred & seventy six, as substitute for one Thomas Harrett, a private soldier in Captain Jonathan Hallett's company, belonging to Colonel Richmore's Regiment of the New York Line.

That he served in said company, Regiment & line until about the first of January seventeen hundred & seventy seven when he enlisted as a private soldier for the term of three

Years in said Captain Hallett's company belonging to the second regiment, commanded by Colonel Philip VanCourtland of the New York Line.

That he served in the last mentioned company, Regiment & Line for the term of two years & more, and that a short time before the expiration of the said term of three years and which he was laying at Rochestssistance from his country for support. That he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services; and that no pension er In the State of New York with his regiment, he enlisted as a private soldier during the war, in said Captain Hallett's Company of the said Second Regiment of the New York Line—and that he continued with & served in the said last mentioned Regiment from thence until the end of the Revolutionary War, when belonging to Captain John Francis Hamtramck's Company, of the said last mentioned Regiment he was, in June seventeen hundred & eighty three, discharged by a regular discharge, which is lost.

That he was in the battles of the White Plains in the State of New York—the Capture of Bourgoine at Saratoga & the battle of Monmoth [Monmouth] and this deponent further saith that he is a resident citizen of the United States at the township of Chatham in the County of Morris aforesaid. That he is in reduced circumstances in life and in need of assistance from his country for support.

That he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services; and that no pension has been heretofore allowed him by the laws of the United States and further this deponent saith now. (Signed) Lewis Noe

Before the subscriber personally appears Lewis Nowe of said County to me well known as a resident of said County more than twenty years & who being duly sworn,

on his oath, that he is the same man, whose name is subscribed thus, "Lewis Noe" to a declaration made on oath before Gabriel H. Ford Esqr., on the 27th April 1818 & hereunto annexed which declaration so made was intended by this deponent as an application to the Secretary of the War Department for a pension under the act of Congress of March 18th 1818.

And this deponent further state that whilst he was in the army he wrote his name thus Nowe in consequence of his name having been thus entered on the rolls of the Company & Regiment Books by the recruiting officer who enlisted him & that his name was thus continued to be written until the time of his discharge; --but that his father & brother always wrote their family name, Noe, & that this Deponent, also has written his name since he left the army in the same manner as his father viz, Noe, & was not aware or did not recollect when he subscribed the declaration before Judge Ford, how his name had been written whilst in the Army.

And this deponent on oath further declares, that he own a small farm of about eighty acres of land, two cows, one horse, two young horned cattle & a few articles of my plain household goods & some few farming utensils & no other property.

That he is indebted for more money than his property worth sell for at present prices. That he is himself a cripple & unable to labor except a small part of his time; that his wife also is a cripple, having had one of her legs amputated near the knee about fourteen years past, that he is poor & needy, dependent on his daily labor for support & requires the assistance of his country for support.
